### *As your school, we will...*

- Provide high quality curriculum and instruction to each student so that all children can meet Utah's student academic achievement standards.
- Provide a grade-level overview of the curriculum taught in an open disclosure document provided by your child's teacher.
  - Use Harcourt Story Town for Language Arts instruction and Houghton Mifflin Expressions for Math instruction
- Hold Parent/Teacher Conferences twice annually during which we will review this compact as it relates to individual student progress.
  - Conferences are scheduled for September 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>, 2012 and February 21<sup>st</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2013. Your teacher will be making an appointment with you for each of the conferences.
- Create a supportive and effective learning environment for each student every day by praising and rewarding positive behaviors and providing appropriate feedback for negative behaviors.
- Report progress of your child's learning on a frequent basis. Report cards will be sent home 3 times during the 2012-2013 school year. If you have any questions regarding your child's performance as well as how to understand the report card, please speak with your child's teacher.
- Provide access to the school's teachers and administrators when questions or concerns arise. Please call your child's teacher if you would like to schedule an appointment to meet with him or her either before or after school at (801) 578-8554.

- Provide opportunities for you to participate in school wide and classroom activities such as family curriculum nights and field trips. We also encourage participation in the classroom through volunteering. Please be sure to sign in at the front office before volunteering.
- Offer materials and ideas that parents might use at home to enhance the ways they are already supporting their child's learning at home.
- Include parents in writing and approving the school improvement plan and other decision making processes through the School Community Council (SCC). Please contact the school's front office at 801-578-8544 if you would like to be involved on the SCC.
- Communicate with parents through Tuesday notes, school newsletter, school website, marquee, and School Messenger to make information friendly, understandable and accessible. Information will be communicated to parents of participating students in an understandable and uniform format including alternative formats upon the request of parents with disabilities and, to the extent practicable, in a language that parents can understand.
